The Downtown Roseville Partnership closed out a decade with major accomplishments under our belt. The vision for our downtown is coming to fruition and we are ready to take on 2020 with even more clarity!

In 2019, the DRP board and partners worked to honor the promise of the organization by remaining focused on the vision:

Action-oriented - The DRP board dedicated hundreds of volunteer hours to executing our strategic plan. This included establishing subcommittees, delegating and tackling projects on deadline, increasing efforts that improve façades, seeking and coordinating event sponsorships and prioritizing board development. Meet Your Board of Directors

Day Porters

Accomplishments

- The Roseville Mural Project was an initiative led by Blue Line Arts in close collaboration with the DRP to bring new public art and a cultural identity of enduring value to the City of Roseville. Phase II is projected for completion in 2020 to spur economic development through the creation of inspired spaces that make the downtown district an exciting area for residents and visitors to work, live, and connect.
- In partnership with the City of Roseville, the DRP is funding a Homeless Navigator position to collaborate with the Roseville Police Department and Homeless Response Team in making service referrals, building trust with chronically homeless and incorporating regular outreach and accountability to individuals who are homeless in Downtown and other areas of the City. This position will support the Social Services Unit's balanced approach to both services and enforcement.
- In partnership with the City of Roseville, the DRP has contracted with private security company First Security Services to address nuisance offenses and quality of life issues in our Downtown. One armed uniformed security guard will be on duty 9 a.m. to 9 p.m., seven days a week, patrolling in a marked vehicle and on foot. The officer handles issues such as loitering/trespassing, parking garage complaints and suspicious people not related to a crime in progress. This is not a replacement for Roseville Police Department, but rather a highly visible and consistent supplement to enhance the safety of our downtown areas, city facilities, and Downtown Roseville Partnership member properties.
- Fencing installed along railroad, in partnership with Union Pacific, provided an aesthetic improvement, as well as additional safety enhancement.



More to Come for 2020

- The Downtown Roseville Façade Improvement Rebate Program will provide financial assistance to cover the cost of materials and City permit fees, in the form of a rebate, to property and business owners committed to enhancing the aesthetic of their buildings and overall appearance of Downtown Roseville, in the amounts between \$1,000-\$10,000 per project.
 These include:
 - Providing opportunities for owners and tenants to participate in the revitalization of their properties
 - Strengthening retail and commercial amenities in Downtown Roseville
 - Implementation of quality site design standards and elements in Downtown Roseville
 - Ensuring projects that create a vibrant and dynamic Downtown

The Downtown Roseville Façade Improvement Rebate Program is a collaboration between the City of Roseville and the Downtown Roseville Partnership. The Façade Program assists in accomplishing several specific goals of the City of Roseville Downtown Specific Plan.

- DRP and the City of Roseville are funding a pilot decorative lighting project for the District. Overhead lights will be installed in the walkway between 316 Vernon Street and 320 Vernon Street in what will hopefully be the first of many locations.
- Downtown Roseville Mural Project Phase II will begin in 2020, in partnership with Blue Line Arts.
- DRP will sponsor Downtown Tuesday Nights and the annual Sylvia Besana Holiday Parade!
