Hometown Parade

Important information - PLEASE READ

Dear Historic District Business Owners and Residents:

The Folsom Historic District Association is pleased to announce that the Historic Folsom's Hometown Parade is taking place on Saturday, June 26, 2021.

As you may know from past experience, in order to meet local police and fire department requirements, street closures are necessary due to staging on Coloma and the parade happening on Sutter Street. *No parking* signs will be hung 72 hours prior to the event. Due to the No Smoking Ordinance, smoking is not permitted at this event.

June 26th

<u>No parking 5am – 11am</u> –No parking on Sutter Street from Reading Street to Scott Street, Wool Street from Figueroa to Sutter Street, Decatur from Figueroa to Sutter Street. Violators will be towed. <u>No parking 5am- 11am</u> - No parking in the Powerhouse Pub parking lot, Planet Earth Rising parking lot, and the Wool and Sutter parking lot. Violators will be towed.

The alley behind Sutter Street shops will be open to businesses/residents only. If you are resident on Wool Street or Decatur inside the barricade, simply inform the road block crew and they will happily let you in or out.

ROAD AND PARKING LOT CLOSURES: RILEY WILL BE CLOSED

At 8am Coloma between Sutter and Natoma will close to traffic except parade entries for staging purposes. If you are resident on Coloma inside the barricade, simply inform the road block crew and they will happily let you in or out.

Riley will close at 9am at Riley and Natoma. Access to Rainbow Bridge from Reading/Leidesdorff to remain open.

Details of event:

Side roads will all close at 9am with exception to Coloma, which closes at 8am.

Parade route is on Sutter Street from Scott Rd to Decatur St. There are approximately 60 entries. The parade will end at approximately 10:45am. Roads will open approximately 11am, as soon as Folsom PD gives us the ok to re-open.

Sutter Street will remain closed, consistent with weekend closures in effect for the remainder of the weekend.

EMT:

Medical Emergency volunteers (CERT) will be on duty and located at Powerhouse Lot. There will be an unarmed security guard at the event. Should you have an emergency please call 911.

Restrooms:

Public restrooms are located:

600 Block – Powerhouse Pub Parking lot

700 Block – Hacienda Parking Lot

800 Block – Restrooms near the Chamber

900 Block – Inside the Parking Garage. ADA restrooms will be available at all locations as well.

PARKING FOR SUTTER STREET ACCESS*

Parking Garage – Reading Street and Leidesdorff – will remain open throughout the event. Trader Lane Parking Lot – Wool and Leidesdorff – will remain open throughout the event. Clouds (Now Artfully Rooted) Parking Lot – Riley or off Scott Road – will remain open throughout event.

Merchants: Please be open by 8:30am. The roads close at 9am so people will enter early.

Light rail information: FREE! Avoid the parking crunch and take light rail to the Hometown Parade! Trains depart every 30 minutes to and from the Historic Folsom Station (Sutter Street).

Park and ride SacRT light rail trains for FREE from:

- Iron Point Station (Iron Point Rd. & Folsom Blvd)
- <u>Glenn Station</u> (Glenn Dr. & Folsom Blvd.)

After the event, light rail trains depart the Historic Folsom Station every 30 minutes on the top and bottom of the hour (i.e., 10 a.m., 10:30 a.m., 11 a.m., etc.).
