



The Endowment was created to support the educational journeys of children and grandchildren of veterans with service-connected disabilities by helping offset housing costs during their undergraduate studies at a community college, college, or university.

Established in recognition of the sacrifices made by these veterans and their families, this scholarship is intended to both honor their service and invest in the next generation. We encourage all eligible students to apply and take advantage of this opportunity for support as they pursue their academic goals.

- The amount of the scholarship will be \$2,500.
- A recipient may only be awarded the scholarship once.
- The scholarship can be awarded in any year of undergraduate study.
- All applications must be postmarked by May 15, 2026.
- The scholarship will be awarded in June of 2026.

Qualifications for the Scholarship

- The recipient must be under 25 years of age, and the child or grandchild of a veteran with a service-connected disability.

Application Materials Required

- A completed application.
- A copy of a high school diploma and transcript, or GED certificate.
- A copy of the veteran's DD 214.
- A copy of the veteran's letter of disability from the Veterans Administration
- A copy of the applicant's birth certificate.
- A statement of financial need, which lists all grants and scholarships that the applicant has received, and a description of why the applicant needs assistance from the Endowment.



Method of Award

A Scholarship Committee Chairperson(s), appointed by the Board of Purple Heart Homes, will receive all applications by May 15, 2026, at 755 Washington Ave., Statesville, NC 28677. Applicants will receive an email confirmation once their application is received, and the selected recipient(s) will be notified by June 30, 2026. A presentation ceremony will be arranged following notification, as schedules allow.

The Scholarship Committee, made up of individuals appointed by Purple Heart Homes, is responsible for reviewing all applications, evaluating essays, and selecting the scholarship recipient(s).

Purple Heart Homes will make reasonable efforts to verify the information provided in each application.

To ensure fairness, each application will be assigned a unique code. Identifying information will be separated so that all applications are reviewed based on merit.

Scholarship funds will be sent directly to the financial aid office of the recipient's college or university in the student's name.
