The Meeting called to order at 5:32 PM. We have a quorum of 8.

Agenda: The June 2026 CVIP Board Meeting Agenda was distributed via email and with no additions, the agenda was approved 8 - 0.

Minutes: The May 2026 Board Meeting Minutes were distributed via email. With no additions or corrections, the Minutes were approved 8 – 0.

President's Report (John R.):

- The \$1000 CVIP Scholarship was awarded to Temperance Calhoun.
- James Jane's daughter was awarded the Doug Wilson Scholarship for \$500.
- Chiloquilters Question – Can the Quilters make baffles for the Crater Learning Center building.
- Need to get the permit for the 4th of July Community Lunch – Larry will do.
- Zuc's BBQ will be serving tri-tip and ribs at the Independence Day Lunch at the Community Center; this lunch is a city sponsored event.
- Sami will attend the KCSD meeting to request a restroom upgrade to the bathrooms at the Little League fields, which will also serve Pop Warner football.

Treasurer's Report (Larry D. Faith W.)

- Center is positive, and the actual change in assets was +\$3887.
- The Board voted to accept the CVIP Admin and Center 2026 Budgets as distributed. Passes: 8 – 0.
- We will be moving Faith's payroll out of the Center and into our programs as recorded by her monthly tracking of her time.
- A small part of the recently awarded operations grant will be moved into Administration each month.
- Larry distributed the new board report: CVIP Programs / Project Financial Review.
- A motion was made to accept the May 2026 financials as distributed and passes 8 – 0.

Community Center & Social Media Report (Bill W. and Faith W.):

- May 2026 had excellent rental numbers with Wind of Wings Church as a new regular renter.
- Social media views were variable with X up and Facebook engagements slightly down.
- Bill touched briefly on the tragedy of the individual who lost his life behind the Center this month.

- Robert expressed concern that the large slash piles behind CHS and private piles as well are a huge fire hazard. Bill said to contact Alex Plascentia. Lomakatsi and the Klamath Tribal crew initially treated the area which is FS land.
- Faith presented some suggested changes to the Bingo fundraiser to discourage “gaming the system”. Nothing was decided.

Executive Director’s Report (Robert C.):

- The Klamath-Lake Community Action Services would like to use the Community Center as a emergency location for the Diaper Give Away. It would be the 4th Monday of each month.
- Robert gave a short report on the League of Oregon Cities Small Cities meeting which he attended.
- Attended the Friends of the Children fundraiser in Klamath Falls with Larry and Christie. Robert was accepted as a new board member.
- The Pacific Power grant was not awarded
- \$13K Good Neighbor grant from TFFF was awarded.
- Sunflower grant from Marie Lamford is being applied for.
- Q3 2026 CVIP Newsletter is available online and in hard copy.
- Next Chiloquin Connects will be July 24th at the Center.
- Sami Jackson and Robert attended the first monthly meeting of the High Desert Museum Program to initiate exploring STEAM through the local Chiloquin landscapes.
- Steve Bitzer will be sworn in in Jan 2027. Need to grow that relationship.
