
One of our foremost goals is to expand the business base in Downtown Rock Springs and grow the retail mix. To that end, we introduced a new program in 2020 - *<u>Project Pop Up</u>*.

A Pop-Up Shop is a short-term retail store that offers new, unique, local or specialized products or services. *Project Pop Up* was designed to fill empty storefronts and prospect new, long-term businesses. It gave one entrepreneur an opportunity start a pop up for the holiday season with a minimal investment with the goal of long-term occupancy after program completion.

OTHER HIGHLIGHTS

- In order to drive traffic during January and February, we developed the **Snowman Stroll** in 2022. Six life-sized snowmen were created by local artists and placed throughout Downtown with accompanying activities.
- At the direction of the City Council, we suggested updates to the <u>Vacant and Abandoned Building</u> <u>Ordinance</u> and identified eleven Downtown buildings that meet the criteria. The ordinance was originally adopted in 2013 to help eliminate blight, increase property values, and improve overall quality of life
- Because Downtown Rock Springs is home to a large number of women-owned businesses, we partnered with Casey Kuckert Consulting to host monthly **Ladies Who Lunch** focused conversations. The lunches are designed to tackle topics faced by women entrepreneurs throughout Sweetwater County.
- Building on our mission to grow the economy in Downtown Rock Springs, we hosted a <u>Small Business</u> <u>Week</u> celebration in May. The celebration included workshops and webinars as well as a Business After Hours networking event.
- May is National Historic Preservation Month. To create awareness about the importance and value of historic preservation we developed a historic architecture scavenger hunt featuring Downtown Rock Springs buildings.
- We hosted monthly **<u>Community Conversations</u>** to further engage our community. The conversations alternated between morning coffee conversations and evening cocktail conversations so anyone could

participate. The conversations are a way to solicit ideas and input from the community at large and were very well attended.

• In November we began working with Downtown Development Services to improve our strategic plan. The plan will be fine-tuned and rolled out in 2023.

PROMOTIONS

Promotions position Downtown Rock Springs as the center of our community and the hub of economic activity, while creating a positive image that showcases Rock Springs' unique character. We've been making some conscious shifts away from one-day special events to more long-term promotions. These promotions are designed to be less labor intensive, more Covid-sensitive, and have a longer "shelf life" to create ongoing traffic and sales for the merchants.

One such promotion was our "Downtown Monsters



We worked with Kaye Tyler to create the monsters and then placed them around Downtown. Merchants got into the spirit with window paintings and we developed scavenger hunts, coloring pages and special monsterthemed events throughout the summer to engage families and draw them Downtown. We saw hundreds of families participating in the summer-long promotion

Utilizing funding from the Wyoming Main Street program, we hosted a **Downtown Shopping Sweepstakes** for Christmas. The program was designed to drive sales to Downtown merchants while allowing us to develop a benchmark to track sales in future years. The sweepstakes encouraged Downtown shoppers to text copies of their receipts from Downtown purchases to our office. We collected **nearly 350 entries** with sales totaling more than \$17,000. While we were thrilled with the response, we know it was a just a small portion of the local sales generated.

THE BROADWAY THEATER

Each year since it's opening, the Broadway Theater continues to expand in attendance and offerings and 2022 was no different. The theater hosted over 100 productions with attendance topping 8,000 - the biggest numbers yet!

Highlights include:

- Continuing our grant from Sweetwater BOCES to continue our student intern program
- Continuation of our social club liquor license at the Broadway Theater
- Hosting the Rock Springs Rotary Club for their weekly meetings in the upstairs conference room
- Serving as the home theater for three community theater groups Actor's Mission, Horizon Theater, and the Starling Company.
