SITE-SPECIFIC ASSISTANCE

TAB assistance can fit any stage of a community's brownfields program. Some examples of communities who've partnered with TAB include:

Union, Nebraska (pop. less than 300)

Visioning workshops, community meetings and roadmap for revitalization

Marble Hill, Missouri (pop. 1,500)

Redevelopment, planning, integrating green infrastructure with a trail system and planning for new stormwater system

Madison, Iowa (pop. 12,000)

Vision and strategic plan for redevelopment of the historic former Tower Tack manufacturing facility

Denver, Colorado (pop. 600,000)

Site inventory, visioning and community meetings to explore reuse of land along the South Platte River corridor for neighborhood connection, revitalization, stabilization, cleanup and redevelopment

SUPPORT

Brownfields technical assistance is available to cities, nonprofits and tribal organizations at no cost. TAB is a national program funded by the US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). TAB helps guide local and tribal governments through the brownfields redevelopment process, using custom-selected teams of experts to address site-specific needs. TAB assistance is usually coordinated through the city, tribal or nonprofit brownfields project manager.

EPA R7: Kansas, Nebraska, Iowa, Missouri

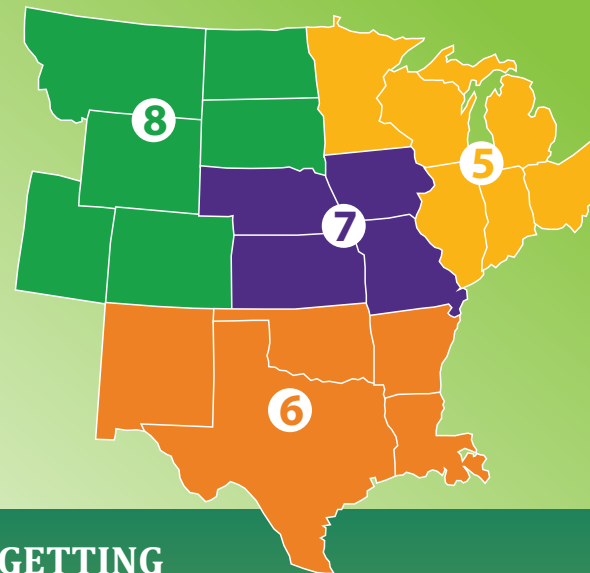
EPA R8: Colorado, Montana, North Dakota, South Dakota, Wyoming, Utah
