- 2. Butch Cassidy's Attorney had his office here
- 3. This building had a special design because it was built directly over old coal mine tunnels
- 4. This building was the site of the Annual Grape Harvest Festival
- 5. This building displays the most extensive use of terra cotta in southwest **Wyoming**
- 6. Calamity Jane worked here in the 1880's
- 7. This space was called "Bunning's Folly" and was where early residents lived in dugouts
- 8. This street was described by National Geographic Magazine as a place where you could see French bakeries, Mexican chili parlors, a Greek Candy shop, Chinese laundries, and Jewish markets.
- 9. If you wanted to pay your bill but fear mouse traps You must be here.
- 10. A restored historic building in Downtown Rock Springs
- 11. This café changed its name in protest of the German Empire during WWI
- 12. An iconic Rock Springs ghost sign (old hand-painted advertising signs that have been preserved)
