





Taste of Rutherford, the summer picnic party, held at the grounds of Oaklands Mansion, is Main Street Murfreesboro's annual fundraising event. Thanks to sponsors and sold-out ticket sales, Main Street was able to reach our goal of \$40,000. Funding raised during this event helps Main Street implement downtown projects such as the property enhancement facade grant, beautification art projects such as bringing the temporary sculptures from Seward Johnson to downtown and renting a billboard on I-24 promoting tourism downtown for four months in 2023. The T.O.R. fundraiser is held in July each summer and relies on local restaurants to attend and provide samples of their food. This event partnered with Mid-State Brew Crew for the fourth year to provide a craft beer garden for guests. This is a family friendly event with food, drinks, music, and fun downtown!

#### **Context:**

A restaurant space with a modern industrial feel created as a destination space. Interior space is eye appealing. Venue includes music and sports events on televisions. Exterior of building maintained to coordinate with all surrounding structures in historic district.

#### Design:

The restaurant space is composed of various building materials and fixtures that create a high-quality space. Exterior garage doors can be lifted to allow people to connect to the outdoors and add an innovative design to the square. The architectural design incorporates a variety of materials and textures that balance the space.



#### **Visual Impact:**

The restaurant is an anchor and focal point of the corner of Maple and College Streets. The exterior of the building is very recognizable from a distance. The design compliments other existing businesses in the area.

#### **History:**

The original use of the building was a cafe/gas station. By creating a restaurant, the owners have brought the space back to its original use. The interior was stripped to the original walls and ceilings. The garage doors replicate the original gas station feel. Exposed brick walls and original rafters bring the space back to the time of its original use. All furniture and fixtures were chosen to respond to the historic use of the space.

#### Context:

The style brings a new, tech savvy atmosphere to the square that attracts more people to the area. Local sports team photos are posted on the walls to help add a local feel. Many of the original brick from the building were left to give a natural feel and a reminder of the history in their space.

#### Design:

The building is composed of three main sections, dividing the different entertainment areas (indoor golf, duckpin bowling, and a bar area with stage). A large area for sports viewing is located in the back with over 40 TVs. The back is laid out for live music on the weekends. There is a private room for indoor golf and catering in the front.

#### **Visual Impact:**

Happy's Sports Lounge creates a new sense of place for West Main Street, adding to the entertainment district downtown. Transparent, large windows that can be opened, illuminating signs, and improved outdoor appearance all add to the ambiance of this building.



## How do you give back to the community?

Murphy doesn't just restaurant he volunteers and gives back to his community. Domenico's sponsors, and Jeff coaches, for MBA 8U and 6U baseball teams, volunteers as soccer and basketball coach at Homer Pittard Campus School. coaches flag football with Murfreesboro National Flag Football league, and basketball with First Shot. Jeff is a guest speaker with American Association Heart and Endure Athletics and Wine Around the Square. His restaurant donates team meals for Oakland High School and provides PCA monthly discounted lunch orders.

# What does your business do to bring people downtown and create a sense of place?

Domenico's participates all downtown events, hosting artists for the Boro Art Crawl and Sip, Shop, and Stroll events, and opening for Wine Around the Square. They participate in Trick or Treat Around the Square and host a Christmas parade watch party. They partner with Simply Pure Sweets as their bread provider and serve Franklin's Fruit Tea, Mayday Brewery, Cedar Glade Brews, and Panther Creek beverages...all local businesses. They provide a quick lunch for those on the square and offer indoor seating for authentic Italian style sandwiches.



How has your business reinvested in downtown?
