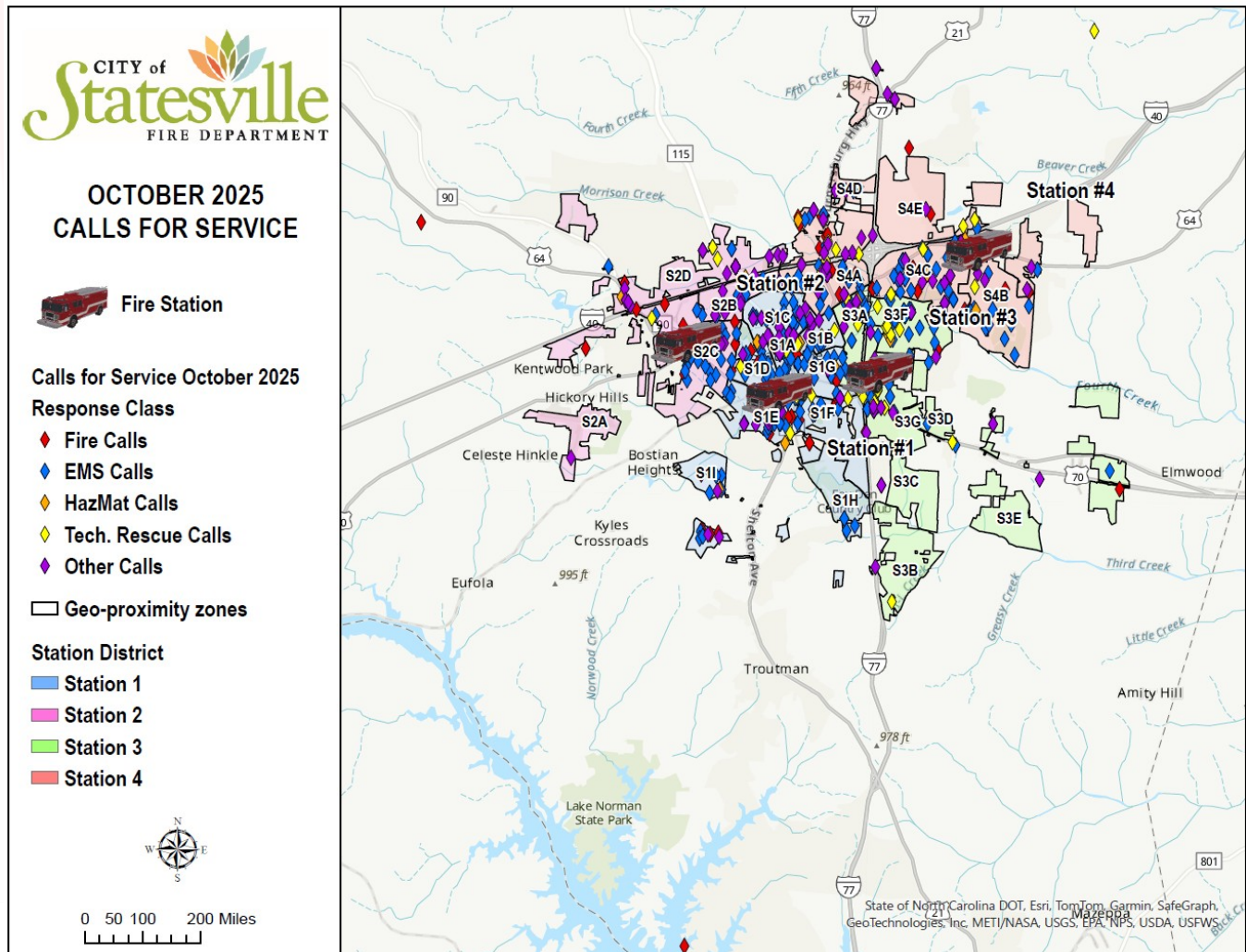

NOTES & ACHIEVEMENTS

1. Call2Recycle "One Drum" collection program for recycling of rechargeable batteries started. The drum is located at Station 1 on the lower level by the employee entrance/exit.
2. The Freedom Response App was put back into effect enabling units to check enroute, on-scene, and clear calls.
3. The second Deputy Chief assessment process was completed.
4. Interviews for 15 new personnel were conducted to plan for the additional staffing needed for implementation of Station 5.
